In the event above procedures have been followed and all avenues of appeals exhausted and documented, and the issue remains unresolved, it is the right of a New York State resident to file a complaint with the [New York State Education Department's Office of College and University Evaluation](#). As a SUNY college, that complaint should be directed to SUNY Central Administration as per the NYSED instructions.

MSCHE is an institutional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation.
