## ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE COUNSELING AAS SCHOLARSHIPS

The New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS) is offering FULL SCHOLARSHIPS to SUNY Sullivan for eligible students to complete the Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counseling AAS and the embedded Credentialed Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor (CASAC) program online.



## **ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS:**

- New York State residents who are at least 18 years of age by the completion of the first semester of the program with a minimum of a high school diploma or a high school equivalency (HSE) diploma.
  - Employees of one of the following (OASAS, OMH, or DOH programs below will be prioritized to receive scholarships):
    - OASAS-certified, funded, or otherwise authorized programs;
    - OMH- and/or DOH-certified Integrated Outpatient Services (IOS-SUD); and
    - DOH drug user health and/or harm reduction programs.
- After priority populations, the following will also be eligible:
  - Individuals working within the addictions field (prevention, treatment, recovery, and/or harm reduction) in an eligible non-OASAS setting such as OMH and DOH programs not listed above; and
  - Individuals or students interested in working in eligible OASAS, OMH, or DOH settings.

## NO STUDENT LOANS REQUIRED!

Students must complete a FAFSA annually, as the OASAS scholarship is considered a "last dollar" grant that bridges the gap between program costs and all other federal and state non-repayable aid (grants and scholarships, but not student loans).
