    - Sean Welsh, Vice President for Administrative Services, and Nancy Bloom, Controller for joining the SUNY Sullivan team and all their work thus far.
    - Or. Crabill, and R. Hanofee for their work with the local school districts to bring all Level II Teaching Assistant's together to share how SUNY Sullivan can assist in providing the necessary courses needed to move from Level I to Level II.

#### **TRUSTEE REPORTS**

## Student Trustee

- F. Lovejoy reported,
  - Events such as the Haunted Theater tour in Fallsburg, National Coffee with a police Officers, pumpkin carving contest, and Halloween Dance have occurred.
  - Some students have noted that textbook affordability is a concern, and causing students to drop classes because they cannot afford them.
  - Some have noted that they are concerned with safety on campus, due to the open accessibility to campus buildings.

#### **Finance**

- P. Gunether reported,
  - Audit is ongoing. RBT is anticipating being able to present at the Board of Trustee meeting in January.
  - Finances are moving in the right direction, we have more control of the information and budget monitoring to ensure the college stays on track with the approved budget.
  - Coordination between the college, dorm and foundation has improved.

#### **Health Science Studies**

## A.Kane, reported,

- C. Taylor is looking to using the transformation funds to help with retention efforts such as, providing transportation to and from clinical for students.
- We will be rolling out the night & weekend cohort starting spring 2025, and it will run from 6-9pm.
- To date, out of the graduating class of 31, 29 have passed their NCLEX exam on the first attempt.

## Sustainability

## P. Adams, reported,

- o Meet with Larry Reeger, Sustainability Coordinator and Kathryn Scullion.
- The Labyrinth is underway. The concrete has been poured, etching will happen in the spring due to the cold tempetures. As well as, installing an ADA ramp.
- Kathy Scullion was able to secure a grant to purchase trees and shrubs to be placed around the labyrinth.
  - Board asked that a letter be sent out to those we receive grants from, and Dr. Crabill noted that the President's Office will coordinate this effort.
- The need for signage around campus for the trails
- Last year we ordered more than 13,000 lbs. of products from the food bank to help with the food pantry operations. Currently, the food pantry sees upwards of 50 shoppers per week.

#### Workforce Development & Community Partnerships

#### E. Galligan, reported,

- Meet with Eleanor Davis, Dean of Communication's, and Dr. Jennifer Wrage, Dean of Student Success and Workforce Development.
- The 50<sup>th</sup> Community Craft Fair held on November 12<sup>th</sup> was very well attended and raised funds and garnered donations for the Food Pantry.
- Our EMT classes are well enrolled.
- J. Wrage and her team continue to develop credit-bearing micro credentials programs. Our spring offerings include Tax Preparer Phlebotomy, Restaurant Management, and Basic Bookkeeping.
- The new testing center, which will administer GED and CLEP exams, as well as other certifications, is almost complete.
- Administration has been meeting with the Community Foundation of Orange and Sullivan to move Foundation scholarships there and build capacity for development processes.

#### Foundation

- P. Adams, reported,
  - Thanked Casey and Eleanor for the work with the foundation.
  - Working on creating a presence in the community. Current board membership is low.
  - Working on identifying funds that can be unrestricted to repay the college for previously awarded scholarships.
    - K. Crabill noted that the team is locating origination paperwork on the funds to be able to transfer to the Sullivan and Orange Community Foundation. An MOU is being drafted.
    - Moving forward the foundation will be identifying what funds and how much can be awarded each year. All payments will be handled through the community foundation.

#### **Presidents Report:**

- Dr. Kathleen Crabill, Officer in Charge
  - Reported
    - MSCHE met today, and we are hoping to receive a call with an update.
    - Community College Presidents are asking for \$97 million dollars in additional funding for workforce development.
    - A taskforce has been established and is led by Senior Vice Chancellor, Johanna Duncan-Poitier.
      - Working on organizing letters of support, as well as being part of the governor's message
    - A Vision Dinner was held on November 14, and had County and state legislators, business leaders and four board members in attendance. It was an opportunity for information to be shared with the college to help the next president.
    - We have a team in place that is currently working on a Title V grant proposal.
    - Thanked Debra Waller-Frederick, Jamie Brooks and Kathy Scullion for their work in the Food Pantry. They are currently, seeking donations for Thanksgiving baskets.
    - Thanked Christina Buckler and her team for their work with enrollment.
       SUNY Sullivan has the highest increased enrollment change out of all community colleges.
